



# Which framework applies to me?

Law graduates undertaking their practice training period (PTP) in the **PUBLIC** sector

## You are eligible for admission under the OLD framework if:

- You became a Qualified Person (QP)<sup>1</sup> **before 1 Nov 2023**
- You pass Part B **before 17 July 2024**
- You complete (the equivalent of)<sup>2</sup> a 36-month PTP **by 16 July 2024**
- You apply for admission as an Advocate and Solicitor **by 16 July 2024**
- You became a QP **between 1 Nov 2023 and 31 Jan 2024**
- You pass Part B **before 1 Nov 2025**
- You complete (the equivalent of)<sup>2</sup> a 36-month PTP **by 16 July 2024**
- You apply for admission as an Advocate and Solicitor **by 31 Oct 2025**

If you are unable to pass Part B, complete PTP, or apply for admission by the above dates but wish to apply for admission under the old framework, you may apply to the Minister for Law for [an exemption, an extension of time to satisfy the admission requirements, and/or an abridgement of your PTP \(MinLaw Application\)](#).

Please note that all MinLaw Applications will be considered on their own merits. If your MinLaw Application is successful, you will have until such extended date to pass Part B, complete PTP, and/or apply for admission.

- You apply for admission as an Advocate and Solicitor

## You are eligible for admission under the OLD framework if:

- You became a Qualified Person (QP)<sup>1</sup> **before 1 Nov 2023**
- You pass Part B **before 17 July 2024**
- You complete (the equivalent of)<sup>2</sup> a 6-month PTP **by 16 July 2024**
- You apply for admission as an Advocate and Solicitor **by 16 July 2024**
- You became a QP **between 1 Nov 2023 and 31 Jan 2024**
- You pass Part B **before 1 Nov 2025**
- You complete (the equivalent of)<sup>2</sup> a 6-month PTP **by 16 July 2024**
- You apply for admission as an Advocate and Solicitor **by 31 Oct 2025**

If you are unable to pass Part B, complete PTP, or apply for admission by the above dates but wish to apply for admission under the old framework, you may apply to the Minister for Law for [an exemption, an extension of time to satisfy the admission requirements, and/or an abridgement of your PTP \(MinLaw Application\)](#).
